Dear Parents/Guardians,

I hope you and your families are well.

On Tuesday, Year 8 had a careers assembly with Leah Chowdhry, who discussed the topics of resilience, the importance of mindset and asking students to find their 'why' in what they do. She is the first British Asian woman to swim across the English Channel and in doing so raised over £250,000 for numerous challenges. She is also the founder and CEO of Pop up, Party & Play, a mobile childcare company. Furthermore, she is the author of children's book 'Making a Splash!', helping children to adopt a similar attitude and teaching them the importance of self-belief. At the end of the talk, she gave students the homework of firstly changing 'I can't' to 'I can' and secondly to do something kind for someone else. Her talk was very inspiring and lots of students were left with many questions for her.

This half term, I want the students to reflect on how they are doing at school. Since their January assessments, many students have started to have conversations with teacher about what they need to do to improve their grades in preparation for their end of year assessments. This is the 'I can' attitude we'd like from all students when they reflect on how they can continue to progress in their academic development.

I look forward to seeing how students show their 'I can' attitude in their engagement in lessons.




Pupil charter
