A week in the life of KS3

Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back! We hope you and your family had a restful and enjoyable Easter break.

As we start this new term, our focus shifts to helping students feel confident and well-prepared for their upcoming assessments and exams. To support them, we held an assembly this week introducing a range of effective revision strategies and exam techniques.

Two key methods we shared with students were the "Look, Cover, Write and Check" strategy and the use of flashcards — both powerful tools for active revision.

Here's how they work:

- Look, Cover, Write and Check involves:
 - 1. Looking at a piece of information they want to learn (e.g. a definition, key date, or formula),
 - 2. Covering it up,
 - 3. Writing it from memory, and then
 - 4. Checking to see if they got it right.

This technique helps students to actively recall information, identify gaps in their knowledge, and improve memory over time through repetition.

Flashcards are small cards students can use to quiz themselves on key facts. Students write a
question or keyword on one side and the answer or explanation on the other. They can use these
independently or with someone else, working through the cards and separating them into "I know
this" and "I need to practise this" piles. This makes revision more targeted and manageable.

How You Can Help at Home:

Here are a few ways you can support your child's exam preparation:

- Help them create and use flashcards for different subjects they're especially useful for key terms, vocabulary, formulas, or quick facts.
- Encourage the use of Look, Cover, Write and Check when reviewing notes or key points.
- Set up a quiet, focused study space with minimal distractions.
- Support them in creating a revision timetable, breaking revision into small, manageable chunks.
 We will be providing students with a copy of revision timetable in the next few weeks for them to complete.
- Test them using their flashcards or encourage them to explain a topic back to you.
- Promote balance ensure they're getting enough sleep, eating well, and taking regular breaks.
- Offer encouragement and reassurance a calm, positive environment can make a big difference.

We'll continue supporting students with these techniques in school and will provide opportunities to practise and refine them. If you would like more advice on helping your child prepare for their exams, please don't hesitate to get in touch.

Homework is key to ensuring your child is revising regularly and stretching their learning further.


Homework Club




Pupil charter
