This week, 9 history students attended a trip to QEB Hollis barrister's chambers as part of a mock trial law enrichment programme. Prior to the trip, students had been sent notes on a case to read. They then split into two teams; defence and prosecution and working with barristers from the chambers assigned roles in their teams. They then practised opening speeches, questioning and cross examining witnesses and closing arguments. They will conduct a mock trial with a real judge in two weeks back at the chambers.

The forgetting curve

The forgetting curve, as theorised by psychologist Hermann Ebbinghaus, states that people start to forget the memory of learnt knowledge in a matter of a few days, unless the knowledge is consciously reviewed time and again. Through constant revision and repetition, knowledge can be embedded into the long term memory store, which can hold infinite knowledge!
