





Lloyds bank trip

Mid-Year assessments

This half term and the first week of next half term is a pivotal time for our students, with exams having begun this week. Our priority is to ensure that each student feels well-prepared and supported to achieve their best in these upcoming assessments. All exam dates and revision materials are on satchel one/show my homework. All other exams will take place in lessons; therefore, it is vital students aim to maintain 100% attendance not only to ensure they are to learn the content of the exams but also are in to take them.

English - Years 7-9 will sit their assessments in class between the 16th of December and the 10th of January.

Maths - Years 7-9 will sit their exams in the Main Hall between the 13th-17th of January.

History – Year 9 exams begin in class week commencing 9th December.

With the Christmas holidays approaching myself and year 9 team are proud of the achievements of the year group and their dedication to academic excellence. After Christmas, the year group will begin to consider which subjects they would like to take for GCSE with presentations given in weekly assemblies alongside options and parents evening in February. GCSE Options

After Christmas, this section will be used to inform students and parents about different options available at GCSE. Last week students watched a performance from Ms Redfern's Year 11 dance class. This exciting course has been designed for young people who want to explore a vocational and practically based study of dance. The course will also provide students with plenty of performance opportunities - both in and out of school.

- Workshops with professional dancers
- Performance opportunities with 'Step Into Dance', a company funded by Royal Academy of Dance & Jack Petchey

Students engage in a variety of styles of dance styles and develop their techniques and rehearsal discipline. Styles can be selected from: contemporary and urban/street-dance. Students will then go on to perform two pieces of dance in different styles in a public show. At the end of this course, students will have gained a deeper understanding of dance in the styles of contemporary, street and jazz, they will have enhanced group work and perseverance skills and improved on dance techniques, confidence and performance skills.




