All other exams will take place in lessons; therefore, it is vital students aim to maintain 100% attendance not only to ensure they are to learn the content of the exams but also are in to take them. These assessments will give both the student and teachers a picture of how they well they will achieve at GCSE. Curriculum leads will be looking at these results when students apply for the GCSE course in February, therefore it is vital students try their best and take these exams seriously.




