I hope you are enjoying the summer break, managing to get some rest and spending valuable time together with family.

Our A level and Level 3 vocational results came out this week and we were once again delighted with the performance of our students. This was a challenging year for all schools as there has been a national deflation of grades back to prepandemic levels. 30% of all our grades were either A* or A and 77% of grades were A*-B. 14 students secured places at Russell Group universities and particular congratulations to Finn Ashworth and Danielle Agiri who both secured places at the University of Oxford.

Return to school arrangements.

The new school year begins on **Wednesday 6th September for all students**:

Years 7 & 12 – 08.25am start and 2.45pm dismissal. **All other years** – 11.30am start and 2.45pm dismissal.

Thursday 7th September will be the normal 08.25am start and 3.05pm dismissal for all students.

School day timings

You may recall that during the Covid restrictions we introduced split lunch and break times for different year groups. This had its advantages but could also be problematic, mainly due to noise levels when lessons were going on. We have now decided to revert to the system of all year groups having lunch and break time together. The only change for you to take into account is a slight change to the end of the school day:

Monday 3.05pm
Tuesday 3.50pm (IST)
Wednesday 3.50pm (IST)
Thursday 3.05pm
Friday 2.35pm

Lunch time food service will be unavoidably busier than students are used to. Your child should consider whether they prefer to purchase food during morning break time when the queues are shorter, and they may use their free school meal allowance at this time. A reminder that free breakfast is available for all students from 7.30 to 8.15am every day.

Uniform and appearance

We are proud of our distinctive uniform and Bacon's College students take pride in their appearance.

A high standard of personal appearance is expected of all students at all times, this includes travelling to and from school. Anyone arriving at school in non-uniform clothing will be sent home to get changed. Chromebooks

We will be starting independent study time (IST) on **Tuesday 12**th **September**. Year 7 will be issued with their Chromebooks on Friday 8th September.

The Chromebook is part of a student's basic equipment and must be brought to school every day. They are not heavy and are compact enough to be carried in a school bag. The battery life is sufficient to last a day in school, but they must be charged at home ready for each day. They remain the property of the school so students must take care of them and may be charged if they are lost or damaged.
