Kitchens

Unfortunately, the extraction system in our kitchen is still inoperable, which is severely limiting the range of hot food that can be cooked. Our catering staff are really doing the best they can in challenging circumstances using the electric ovens and Food Technology classroom. The system is over 30 years old and investigating the original problem has uncovered more issues. Several specialists are working on solutions, and we hope to commence replacement works in the next few weeks.

Attendance
