We are also incredibly proud of our students' achievements in PE. Our girls' football team continues to go from strength to strength, having now progressed to the semi-final stages of the London leagues following an impressive 5–0 victory over Deptford Green. Their determination, teamwork, and skill have been outstanding.

We also celebrate the success of our boys' rugby team, who performed brilliantly to finish as runners-up in their recent tournament—an excellent achievement that reflects their hard work and commitment.

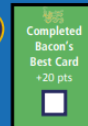
