



# Home-School Partnership

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- We ask Parents/Carers to give their support so that the focus of communication is on the positives.
- We seek to reward and celebrate achievements regularly and especially in our half termly celebration assemblies.
- The school will work closely with you and your child to develop the necessary programme of support and monitoring for improvement, if we find that they are repeatedly disrupting learning.
- At Bacon's College we will not tolerate those who disrupt the school experience for others, either within or beyond the classroom.



# Home-School Partnership

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- At Bacon's College, Parents and Carers are welcomed, informed and involved in their child's education. The three-way partnership between Parents/Carers, students and the school is built on **shared trust**, **confidence** and **understanding**. We find that working together in this way is essential for each young person's success.
  
- The Home-School Partnership is underpinned by good communication which includes:
  1. Early contact in the Spring and Summer Terms prior to starting at the school in Year 7
  2. A parent information evening
  3. A parent information pack
  4. Regular school newsletter
  5. Acknowledgement of awards and prizes
  6. Regular contact with your child's Form Tutor
  7. Termly progress reports
  8. An early transition evening with your child's Form Tutor
  9. An annual parent evening for you to meet with your child's subject teachers
  10. Electronic communication of letters and information
  11. Daily monitoring of your child's day at school through Arbor parent portal

# Home-School Partnership - Parents

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We ask our Parents/Carers to:

- Ensure that their child attends school every day, on time, wearing their full school uniform and properly equipped for learning
- Make contact with the school before 8.30am if, for any reason, their child is not able to attend school
- Ensure that the school has up to date contact details (telephone and email) for emergency use
- Support their child with homework by providing encouragement and a quiet working space at home
- Encourage their child to participate in extra-curricular activities
- Support our Behaviour for Learning Policy where necessary – for instance, making any necessary arrangements for their child to complete any detentions
- Attend parent evenings
- Ensure that the Parent Pay account of their child is kept topped up and in credit
- Ensure that they do not need to take their child out of school for any unauthorised absences, such as holidays during term time

- Arrive at school on time each day, smartly wearing a full school uniform and with all the necessary equipment
- Complete all homework tasks set on time and to the best of their ability



# Lunch System

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
- Students will be taken through the school lunch system on their transition morning in July. Lunch will be free of charge for the transition morning only.
- Cashless system – all parents will have access to an Arbor account to top money up on a student's accounts. Arbor is used to pay for lunch and trips. Please top up the account the night to ensure the money has gone onto the account in time for lunch the next day.
- Students on free school meals will have £2.32 topped up to their account for lunch. Please note that the free school meals does not accumulate on a student's account.
- Students will have their thumb prints set up to their account. Their biometric scan of their thumb will be used to identify the student and purchase items at lunch.
- Students can bring packed lunch (also possible on the transition morning). **Sugary drinks/snacks are not allowed.**




# Classroom warning procedure as follows;

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## Warning 1

- Teacher will explain to you why you have received a warning and how your behaviour has disrupted learning.
- Teacher will write your name on the board with a tick to signify your first warning.



## Warning 2

- Teacher will explain to you why you have received a warning and how your behaviour has disrupted learning.
- Teacher will add a second tick to your name to signify you are on your second and final warning.

## Warning 3

- Teacher will explain to you why you have received a warning and how your behaviour has disrupted learning.
- Teacher will ask you to collect your belongings and make your way to the ISOLATION Room.
- You will have **3 minutes** to make your way to the Isolation Room – if you take longer than 3 minutes to make your way there you will be Excluded.

# Mobile Phone Policy

Mobile phones should be off during the school day.


If your child's phone is seen or heard, their phone will be confiscated. Should your child's phone be confiscated, you will need to collect their phone from the School Office.

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
